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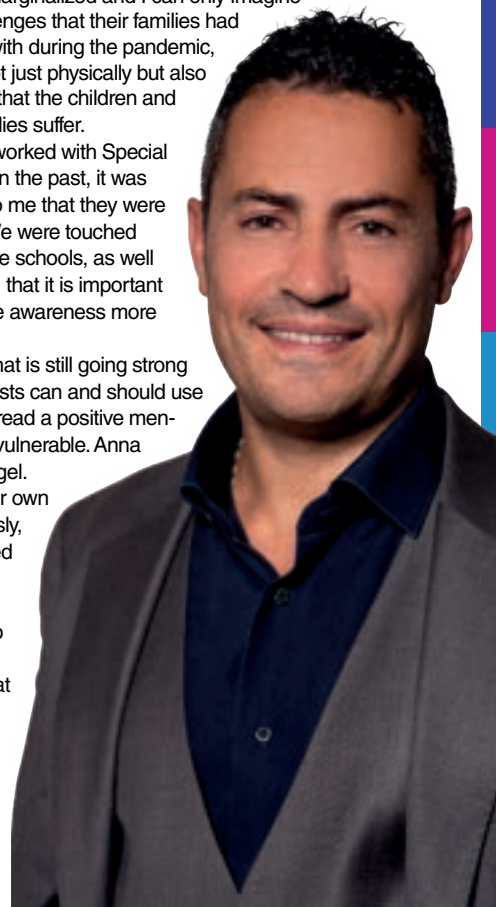
adly, even in 2021, children with special needs are still marginalized and I can only imagine the challenges that their families had to cope with during the pandemic, as it is not just physically but also mentally that the children and their families suffer. “Having worked with Special Schools in the past, it was evident to me that they were

in dire need of additional funding and support. We were touched by the great efforts of the teachers and staff of the schools, as well as of the children's parents. Furthermore, we feel that it is important not only to raise funds for the schools but to raise awareness more generally of this issue in Cyprus as well.

“Anna Vissi has had an incredible career – one that is still going strong – in a very competitive industry. I believe that artists can and should use their voice to give back, raise awareness and spread a positive mental attitude among their fans, including the most vulnerable. Anna has been a true friend and she is our Cypriot angel. “All the YCF's philanthropic endeavours have their own story and each one is extremely special. Obviously, the 3rd Kaimakli Primary School, which I attended as a child, is close to my heart, as is the one in Rizokarpaso too.

- To improve their living conditions and quality of life, so that they may grow up in a safe and healthy environment.
- To empower students and youth in general to create a better future for themselves.
- To offer resources to improve the quality of life of children and young people with special needs.

THE FOUNDATION'S VISION

The Foundation envisions creating equal opportunities for the development and education of children and young people in societies that offer access to quality education, by helping them fully utilize their abilities. The Foundation strives to have a positive impact on children's development, by investing in projects in Special School units and orphanages.

THE FOUNDATION'S COMMITMENT

The empowerment, support and development of young people involves many sectors. For this reason, the Foundation has committed to support children, young people and their families in the following four areas.

- Education: Infrastructure Enhancement
- Talent Development and Promotion
- Social & Emotional Learning
- Support to Underserved Children and Their Families

The Foundation grants funding, provides equipment/products and offers services through the organization and implementation of special programmes in selected sectors (educational programmes, training, sports, health/social welfare, etc.). All its activities are implemented either independently or in collaboration with other entities, charitable

organisations or community groups, which share the Foundation's passion for helping children in need. In general, the Foundation undertakes projects that are selected through its own research and procedures. Additionally, requests submitted by other entities which promote the aims of the Foundation are also considered.

SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS

The Foundation has completed numerous projects during its time of operation in Cyprus. On the following pages, we present three of the projects that have been successfully implemented together with interviews with the representatives of each project, who have shared the benefits enjoyed by the children following the Foundation's donations.

(1) The 3rd Kaimakli Primary School in

Nicosia, where the YCF renovated and created a multi-purpose high-tech room, upgraded the outdoor basketball court and constructed a sunshade over the court.

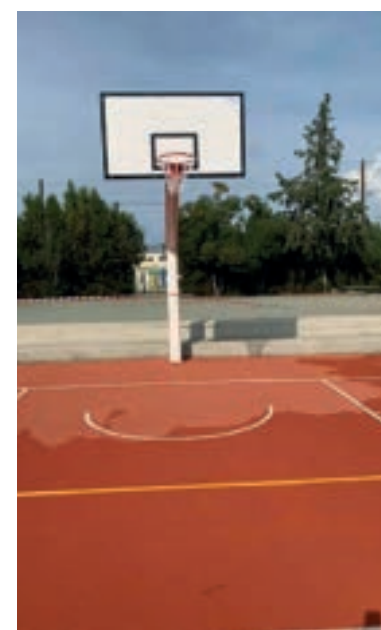
(2) Sistema Cyprus, which the YCF has supported since it was set up to offer free music education to vulnerable groups of children. Initially, the YCF purchased 18 string instruments and this year it has

also bought a new set of percussion instruments.

(3) The Nicosia Children's House, where the YCF has fully renovated the ground floor and equipped the house with new furniture, laptops, a TV, a printer and other useful equipment. It has also created two study rooms for the children, a new dining room, a library and a common area.

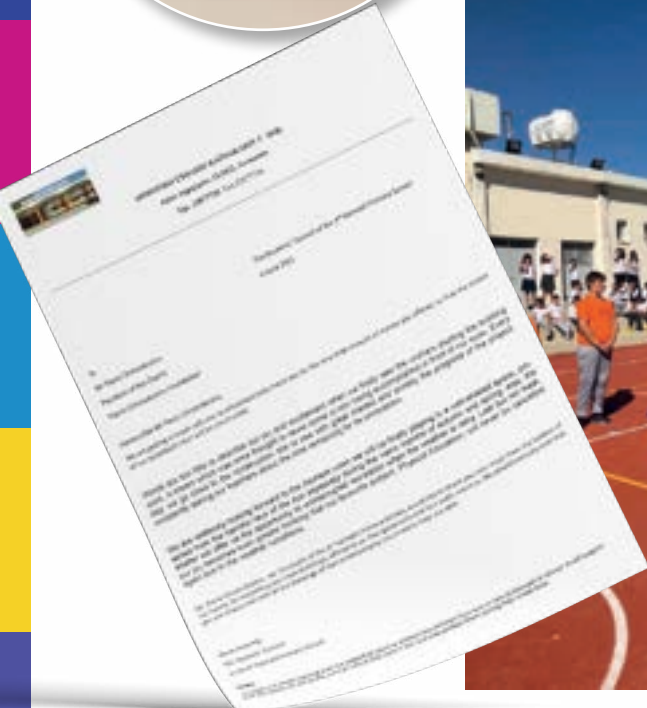

“T

he Foundation has donated music instruments to Sistema Cyprus twice, in 2018 and in 2021. On both occasions the children felt very important, knowing that they had been given a rare opportunity and they also felt responsible for their musical instruments. Especially at the beginning they were extremely careful. The moment that I will always remember was when the double bass children entered the room and they saw their double basses. They stayed by the door, shocked, as if they couldn't believe that these big instruments were actually for them. The children with the cellos would take 15 minutes opening their instruments every time, just to be careful. The children who play violas would carry their instruments on their backs all the time when not at Sistema and their parents wore Yianis Christodoulou hats every day. The percussionists would play the timpani, marimba, xylophone and glockenspiel with such pride and a constant smile.



"According to our philosophy, there is charitable action that is devoid of respect for those who benefit from it, and there are true acts of love, which acknowledge the worth and the humanity of the people being served, which is definitely what The Yianis Christodoulou Foundation does in Cyprus. It is a foundation that truly cares about children. Whenever we meet with Mr. Christodoulou, he remembers some of our children's names and asks to see them."

he UN Convention on the Rights of the Child is an international instrument for the promotion and protection of the rights of the children around the globe. Within this framework, the Yianis Christodoulou Foundation in close cooperation with the Social Welfare Services of the Ministry of Labour, Welfare and Social Insurance, proceeded with the renovation of two Children's Homes in Cyprus, which host children under the care of the Director of Social Welfare Services.

“The renovation projects were undertaken, based on the mission and the vision of the Yianis Christodoulou Foundation to provide children with the necessary means so as to reach their full potential and improve their lives, and recognizing the right of children to grow up in a family environment, in an atmosphere of happiness, love and understanding in order to develop his/her personality fully and harmoniously. ISLANDWIDE SPECIAL SCHOOLS COMPETITION

Helping Children Hands Up For All

THE YIANIS CHRISTODOULOU FOUNDATION (YCF) WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS OF THE SPECIAL SCHOOLS THAT PARTICIPATED IN THE ISLANDWIDE SPECIAL SCHOOLS COMPETITION ENTITLED HELPING CHILDREN – HANDS UP FOR ALL. THROUGH THE COMPETITION, THE YCF WANTED TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH VARIOUS DISABILITIES/NEEDS ATTENDING SPECIAL SCHOOLS WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD ON THEIR CREATIVITY, INTERESTS AND TALENTS THROUGH ART- OR MUSIC-RELATED WORKS THAT CONVEY THE UNIVERSAL VALUES OF EQUALITY, LOVE, RESPECT, FRIENDSHIP, INCLUSION, ACCESS, ETC.



All the Special Schools in Cyprus demonstrated great interest in participating and worked really hard to send a

wide range of entries: amazing songs and videos that show the work of the teachers and students, colourful drawings, 3D artworks and more. The judging process was hard and the panel faced numerous challenges before reaching its verdict.

In accordance with the regulations of the Hands Up For All competition, three main prizes with a total value of €17,000 were awarded to three winning

schools: €10,000 (1st prize), €5,000 (2nd prize) and €2,000 (3rd prize). After making a careful consideration of all the entries and recognizing the amount of effort and time that the teachers and the students had devoted to the competition, the YCF decided that the 3rd prize of €2,000, should be awarded equally to the remaining six Special Schools, taking the total prize money for the eight competing schools to €27,000.

THE 1ST PRIZE OF €10,000 WAS AWARDED TO THE **SAINT SPYRIDON SPECIAL SCHOOL** (LARNACA) FOR THE SONG *I CREATE, I SHARE, I LOVE. THAT'S WHO I AM* AND ITS ACCOMPANYING VIDEO. THE MAIN SINGERS ARE NEFELI ANTONIOU, GIORGOS ANASTASIOU AND ANDRY KAKOUSHI. “One important aspect of education in Special Schools is the strong focus on health, safety and behavioural needs. Our school professionals – teachers and therapists – play a critical role in the students’ lives and education, especially those with severe needs, autism or behaviour issues. Our plan is to increase the impact of our staff by providing them with the right resources, so they can perform to the highest standards and develop the social, emotional, and behavioural support that our school provides. ‘An ever-increasing challenge at our school is the enrolment of young children, sometimes as young as 5½ years old. Their needs are much different from their older schoolmates’ at a school that was purposely built for them. Our younger students need special indoor and outdoor spaces so that they can thrive in safety and comfort. Our plan is to use the proceeds from the event to create those spaces by purchasing toys, furniture and technical equipment that are suitable for them. Therefore, we need to close a funding gap to make sure that our younger students have the right equipment when they need it, instead of waiting for months or sometimes years, for the ministry’s internal procurement processes. ‘A huge thank you from the Nicosia Special School to the Yianis Foundation for organising and hosting the Gala Dinner with the goal of supporting the nine Special Schools in Cyprus. We knew that setting up the *Hands Up For All* competition last year was the beginning of something beautiful and we were delighted that last year’s contribution to the Nicosia Special Education School generated immense energy and the engagement of our students. We are certain that this year’s activities will generate even more enthusiasm. Our students always love new stuff. “Giving back means fighting for a cause and realising that there are people who face greater challenges; as a community, it should be our prerogative to help them. 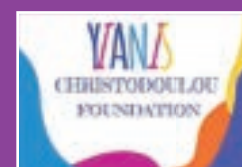

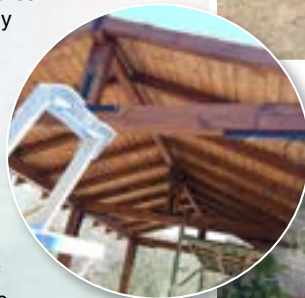

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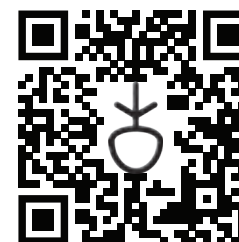

“S

aint Barnabas School for the Blind is the oldest Special School in Cyprus and the only one for children with visual impairment. The School provides services to more than 250 visually impaired children of all ages from across Cyprus and to over 150 adults too. Although it is a state school, its needs cannot be met by government funding alone and so the proceeds of the fund-raising event will go towards supporting several

of the School's programmes (e.g. horse riding therapy) or to the creation of a sensory garden (using textures, smells, sounds, water, etc.) for the children.

“We expect that, with this donation, the School will manage to complete tasks that cannot be funded by the annual budget so that visually impaired children will gain joyful and valuable experiences that are very important to their development.

“The Yianis Christodoulou Foundation, through its concern and initiatives for the benefit of children and, in our case, those with visual impairment, is like the Good Fairy that makes beautiful dreams come true! What is really amazing and invaluable to us is the fact that The Yianis Christodoulou Foundation comes to our aid without us even having to ask.

“It is very important to realise that we are not

alone on planet Earth. No human being can live on his/her own; we all need one another. Human relationships and human interactions are those which identify us and characterize our development and the path we take in life. Even if it seems that we have everything and we don't need any help or support, the need for giving is there. Some people tend to forget that they are social beings who need to feed not just their bodies but their souls too. They also forget that their way of life can be a model or a mirror for others.
